School Closure

Due to the Covid 19 pandemic, our school was closed to pupils from 13th March and this closure was subsequently extended to the remainder of the school year. Teachers set activities to support distance learning on a weekly basis using work packs and online resources. Support of and communications with our families were hugely important to us during closure.

Policy Development

Policies worked on and reviewed by the BoM this year include: School Self Evaluation Plan (2018 -2020), Admissions Policy (Approved by Patron). In-school procedures are reviewed regularly throughout the year.

Primary Language Curriculum

Our school was very lucky to secure PDST support during this school year in relation to the new Primary Language Curriculum. This support was specifically tailored to suit our school.

Curricular Development

School Self-Evaluation continued with focus on the use of oral Irish as a means of general communication throughout the school. Literacy Lift Off was continued for junior pupils and graded reading continued for seniors. Team teaching was used in the junior room for Mata sa Rang and in the senior room for Maths Blast, IZAK9 and novel. Our graded approach to the teaching of spellings continued and we investigated and trialled an online approach which allows for individual progression with spelling and can be monitored both in class and online by teachers. Robotics was introduced in the senior room and we took part in the Creative Schools' Programme. In relation to well-being, we partook in Amber Flag programme. Teacher CPD took place in the New Language Curriculum, PE, Maths Differentiation and the Incredible Years Programme
